Here is some additional information on Opportunities for Ohioans with Disabilities (OOD) hearing aid purchase questionnaire. This is in our Ohio Administrative Code which has specific requirements for hearing aid purchases:

OAC 3304-2-53:

(D) RSC shall purchase hearing aids only from dealers who agree to the following conditions:

(1) To provide a thirty-day trial period, free of charge, and to charge RSC only for the cost of the ear mold if the trial period, the consumer cannot adjust to the aid or refuses to use the aid, or the aid is not working properly and

(2) To guarantee the aid and all parts for one year with normal use and to service the aid during that period.
